WORKSHOP A:

EVOLUTION OF THE OSTEOPATHIC CONCEPT OF PERCEPTION/ACTION

Bruno Ducoux D.O., M.Sc. (F)

Bruno is a devoted teacher and practitioner valued by both the community and his students. As an International speaker, he has taught in Europe, the US and Russia. He is a Founding member of the "Académie d'Ostéopathie" in France and of the journal Apostill, he is a member of the executive council of the WOHO and also director of research training in pediatric osteopathy. He teaches at Diderot University within the DU and practices in Bordeaux, France. Member of the FROP, he is involved in the treatment of the newborn and young children. He is an excellent teacher; he transmits the essence of his work to participants and guides them to succeed in their practice.

Evolution of the notion of palpation, from perception towards action.

As with any craft or science, osteopathy is constantly evolving. It is necessary to establish ourselves with our traditions, but also to open ourselves to new horizons of perception and awareness.

Osteopathy can be practiced using a biomechanical model, with deductive reasoning and reproducible techniques using the practitioner's force. Also, many researches have shown that osteopathy may be practiced using a systematic inductive method using the inherent strengths present in the body and in the environment.

Many elements reveal themselves throughout this presentation:

A new understanding of the transmission of information through the nervous system: central, autonomic and fluidic -The vibratory fulcrum in the tissues and the fluids - The extracellular matrix as a source of information - Emotional integration and energy flow obstructions compromising health - The importance of mental health and healthy thinking including it's nuances

- Still's vitalistic approach and the retroactions between the patient and the therapist in a very specific environment.

From palpation to an integration of the palpatory knowledge - The fulcrum and it's interface - The use of a non linear reasoning based on the aspects of discontinuity in the matter - The integration of the cosmic biomagnetic fields in the principles of osteopathy - These fields are present in every cell and relate to the photons generated partly by the heart.

«Life molds the body starting from the heart»

An evolutive, and most definitely subjective osteopathy will be presented, using the forces present in the perceptible world with the heart as the point of resilience.

This osteopathy is a cosmic model, based on a tissular and biodynamic approach.

Self growth and growth in our environment is used as a fulcrum and as a witness.

All of these principles are already present in Stills writings.



Practical techniques that will be taught during the workshop

During the workshop, Bruno Ducoux will be showing many ways of working with this model of perception/ action through a very multidimensional vision.

Our evolution in the universe - Solid roots for the therapist - Synchronizing with the patient and the environment - Touch / palpation / perception - Lymphatics and circulatory technics - Technics for the central and autonomous nervous system - Importance of symmetry and of the vertical midlines - The horizontal diaphragms and the extracellular matrix/fascial chains - The vibratory fulcrum and the memories in relation to the fluids - The sense of the palpatory feeling - Neutrals (in space) - Silences (in time) - The silent partner in the interface - Still Point - Activities in mindfulness - Treatments for letting go and discarding egos in all - The heart as a generator - Opening the heart of the Univers.

WORKSHOP B:FLUIDIC APPROACH TO TREATMENT OF CONNECTIVE TISSUE

Jane Eliza Stark D.O. (Can)

Jane holds an undergraduate degree from the University of Guelph in Biology (1980) and a Master's degree from Walden University in Clinical Research Administration (2014). She also holds diplomas from Sheridan College in Sports Injury Management (1990), the College D'études Superior in Somatotheraphy (2001), and the Canadian College of Osteopathy, in Osteopathy (2003). Atman College in Sophia France bestowed the honorary degree of Honoris Causa to Jane in 2008.

Jane has been practicing as a certified Athletic Therapist since 1991, and as an Osteopathic Manual Practitioner since 2003. She currently serves on the faculty of three osteopathic colleges, the Japanese Traditional Osteopathic College in Kobe Japan, the Canadian College of Osteopathy with campuses in Toronto and Winnipeg and the Collège d'Études Ostéopathiques with campuses in Vancouver and Halifax. She has been the director of research at the Canadian College of Osteopathy since 2007. Jane has been on the 1996 Canadian Medical Team for the Paralympic Games in Atlanta and on the 1998 Commonwealth Games in Kuala Lumpur. As well, she was the team therapist for the Canadian Men's Rugby Team between the years 1991-1995, retiring after the World Cup which was held in South Africa in 1995.

Jane is recognised internationally as an osteopathic historian, author, and workshop leader on the fluidic approach to treating connective tissue. To date, Jane has lectured or taught in 10 countries.
